- 201 **Grüner Veltliner, Wieninger 2005 Kamptal** 25  
*Light, delicate and dry, with a tinge of green grass.*
- 203 **Grüner Veltliner, Hirsch 2007 Kamptal** 40  
*Dry, with mouth-watering acidity and a clean crisp finish.*

### Germany

- 21 **Riesling, Donnhoff 2006 Nahe** 36  
*Estate bottled Riesling from world renowned winemaker, fleshy fruit with lingering acidity.*
- 22 **Riesling Dry, Selbach 2006 Mosel** 26  
*Slate and mineral on the nose, with a soft, fruity middle finishing on the dry side.*
- 23 **Riesling Kabinett Trocken, Ratzenberger 2007 Mittelrhein** 32  
*Half dry with notes of orange segments and minerals.*
- 24 **Riesling Trocken, Heddesdorf 2007 Mosel-Saar-Ruwer** 28  
*Bright, intense fruit with concentrated minerality and very dry finish.*
- 25 **Riesling Spatlese, Ratzenberger 2007 Mittelrhein** 38  
*Medium to full bodied, with ripe fruit, intense acidity, and custard on the palate.*
- 28 **Riesling Kabinett, Selbach-Oster "Sonnenuhr" 2007 Mosel** 35  
*Slightly sweet with balanced acidity and fruit.*
- 29 **Riesling Kabinett, Leitz 2007 Rheingau** 26  
*Lively fruit with beautiful underlying minerality.*

### France--Loire Valley (Sauvignon Blanc & Chenin Blanc)

- 32 **Muscadet Sèvre et Maine Sur Lie, Fromenteaux 2007** 24  
*Bone dry, light-bodied wine with bracing acidity and clean, subdued fruit, great with oysters.*
- 33 **Sauvignon Blanc, Patient Cottat 2006 Loire** 25  
*Light, crisp and dry Sauvignon from the Loire, ideal with shellfish.*
- 34 **Sancerre "Le Clos de Chaudenay," Daulny "Vielles Vignes" 2007** 38  
*Mineral and wet stone on the nose and palate, medium-bodied and quite dry.*
- 35 **Sancerre "Chavignol," Delaporte 2007** 45  
*Crisp and minerally, with citrus and melon flavors, and a gentle finish.*
- 37 **Vouvray, Poniatowski Clos Baudoin 1990** 75  
*Mature Chenin Blanc, perfect balance of fruit and acid for this age-worthy white.*
- 38 **Vouvray, Domaine Pichot 2007 Loire Valley** 35  
*Estate bottled Chenin Blanc, full-bodied, with aromas of honeysuckle and melon, and a bright acidic finish.*

### Alsace

- 39 **Riesling, Barmes Buecher "Tradition" 2005** 28  
*Good weight with vibrant acidity.*
- 40 **Pinot Blanc, Barmes Buecher "Rosenberg" 2006** 34  
*Deep minerality and fresh acidity, with rich fruit and a touch of nuttiness on the finish.*

### Burgundy (Chardonnay)

- 51 **Mâcon-Davayé, Domaine des Valanges 2008** 28  
*Well-made, dry 100% Chardonnay with a touch of earth, nuts, spice and cream on the palate.*
- 52 **Rully 1er Cru "Les Cloux" Girardin 2006** 40  
*A wonderful value in white Burgundy, beautiful apple and fig surrounded by well-balanced texture and body.*
- 53 **Viré Clessé Bonhomme 2005** 36  
*Old vine Chardonnay grapes producing wine that rivals Pouilly-Fuissé.*
- 54 **Pouilly-Fuissé, Frederic Trouillet 2006** 42  
*Medium to full-bodied and balanced with just a touch of creaminess; classic Pouilly.*
- 58 **Chablis 1er Cru, Louis Michel 2006** 65  
*Five generations of winemakers, the Michel family produces this classic Terroir influenced Chablis.*
- 59 **Meursault-Charmes, Domaine Germain 2006** 87  
*Ripe with aromas of spiced apple, pear and peach; finishes long with a touch of nuttiness*
- 60 **Puligny-Montrachet, Sauzet 2006** 95  
*Elegant, with defining powerful fruit, long lasting acidity, and silky texture.*
- 61 **Chassagne-Montrachet, Sauzet 2006** 90  
*Forty year old vines produce a wine with dense fresh flavors of citrus, with a firm edge of acidity.*
- 62 **Chablis Grand Cru "Grenouilles," Louis Michel 2005** 85  
*Classic Chablis with crisp minerality and great length on the finish.*

### **Southern France**

- 66 **Château Gravelle-Lacoste 2007 Graves** 32  
*Medium-bodied and minerally, great wine with shellfish.*
- 67 **Château Carbonnieux 2005 Bordeaux** 65  
*Sauvignon Blanc that is medium-bodied, dry and fragrant.*
- 69 **Côtes du Rhone, Perrin “Reserve” 2006** 25  
*Peach scented and intensely flavored dry white.*
- 71 **Viognier, Domaine Cheze Cotes du Rhone Blanc 2007** 50  
*Dry and rich, with an exotic aroma of caramel and tangerine.*

### **Italy**

- 64 **Pinot Grigio, Lagaria 2008 Veneto** 26  
*Light, crisp and dry, a versatile food wine.*
- 65 **Pinot Grigio, Bolognani 2007 Trentino** 32  
*Medium-bodied with a bit more weight and complexity than the Lagaria.*
- 68 **Moscato d’Asti, Veglio 2007 Piemonte** 26  
*Floral and fruity with a pleasant effervescence and natural sweetness.*

### **Australia-New Zealand**

- 72 **Chardonnay, Vasse Felix 2007 Margaret River** 36  
*Full-bodied, with hints of French oak and fresh acidity.*
- 73 **Sauvignon Blanc, Cloudy Bay 2008 Marlborough** 48  
*Full flavored and distinctive with hints of kiwi, lime and orange zest.*
- 75 **Sauvignon Blanc, Millsreef Reserve 2007 Hawkes Bay** 36  
*Intensely flavored, medium to full-bodied wine with hints of kiwi, lychee and apricot.*
- 76 **Sauvignon Blanc, Catalina Sounds 2007 Marlborough** 28  
*Classic Marlborough style Sauvignon Blanc, balanced, fresh, and crisp.*

### **United States**

- 77 **Riesling, Wente 2007 Monterey** 26  
*Approachable Riesling with floral aromas and ripe fruit, from 5<sup>th</sup> generation winemaking family.*
- 78 **Pinot Gris, Au Bon Climat 2007 Santa Barbara** 32  
*Fresh peach flavors, with aromas of lavender, and soft acidity. A great summer wine.*
- 79 **Viognier/Marsanne, Tablas Creek 2007 Paso Robles** 38  
*Spicy aromas of stone fruit, minerals follow on the palate; rich and full-bodied with a peachy finish.*
- 80 **Pinot Gris, Chehalem 2007 Oregon** 33  
*Peach and nectarine and a refreshing core of acidity and a soft, smooth finish.*
- 82 **Gewürztraminer, Navarro 2005 California** 32  
*Spicy fruit with a hint of pine nut, medium-bodied and a dry finish.*
- 83 **Viognier, Cline 2007 Sonoma** 26  
*Aromatic full bodied Viognier with flavors of apricot and peach, with low acidity.*
- 84 **Fume Blanc, Ferrari-Carano 2007 Sonoma** 34  
*Passion fruit, melon and grapefruit with some zest in the finish.*
- 85 **Sauvignon Blanc, Firestone 2007 Santa Ynez Valley** 26  
*Passion fruit, melon and grapefruit with some zest in the finish.*
- 86 **Sauvignon Blanc, Joseph Phelps 2006 Napa Valley** 55  
*Fresh citrus balanced with tropical fruit flavors, and just a touch of oak.*
- 87 **Sauvignon Blanc, Beckmen 2008 Santa Ynez Valley** 30  
*Ripe and well balanced with a rich core of fruit and a moderate oak influence.*
- 88 **Chardonnay, Ferrari- Carano 2006 Russian River Valley** 38  
*Balanced flavors of apple, fig, and spice, with an earthy edge, and some French oak.*
- 92 **Chardonnay, Talley 2007 Arroyo Grande Valley** 50  
*Layers of complex fruit framed in oak, a balanced intricate wine.*
- 93 **Chardonnay, Bouchaine 2006 Carneros** 36  
*Medium-bodied and firmly layered, with just enough fruit to maintain balance and harmony.*
- 95 **Chardonnay, Jordan 2006 Sonoma** 60  
*Classic Russian River fruit produces this balanced wine with hints of green apple and citrus.*
- 96 **Chardonnay, Plumpjack “Reserve” 2007 Napa** 80  
*Rich full and round, with balanced fruit and acidity.*
- 97 **Chardonnay, Elizabeth Spencer 2006 Sonoma** 46  
*Moderately oaked with hints of apple and spice and a soft, long finish*
- 99 **Chardonnay, Hanzell 2005 Sonoma** 90  
*Elegant Chardonnay made in a more traditional Burgundian style: more fruit, less oak.*

**Red Wines**  
**Burgundy (Pinot Noir)**

- 108 **Meursault Rouge, “Clos des Mouches” Henri Germain 2005** 85  
*Full ripe fruit, followed by earthy rich undertones, and lingering intensity.*
- 109 **Côtes de Nuit Village, “Les Vaucrain” Daniel Rion 2006** 65  
*Spicy, concentrated Pinot Noir, with a fleshiness that pairs well with red meat.*
- 110 **Nuits-St-George, “Les Vignes Rondes” Daniel Rion 2006** 78  
*Full bodied with aromas of cherry and truffle.*
- 111 **Bourgogne, “Cuvee St. Vincent” Girardin 2005** 38  
*Medium bodied with forward red fruit and food friendly acidity.*

**Bordeaux (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc)**

- 114 **Château Jean-Faure Grand Cru 2006 Saint Émilion** 60  
*Situated adjacent to Cheval Blanc; at half the price. Full and generous, with black currant and ripe tannins.*
- 115 **Château Haut-Maurac 2005 Médoc** 38  
*Ripe fruit and biodynamic winemaking methods produce this well structured food friendly wine.*

**Other France**

- 122 **Vacqueyras, “Les Christins” Perrin & Fils 2006** 40  
*Juicy and fresh, with underlying herbal and spicy notes, and a long pleasing finish.*
- 123 **Crozes Hermitage Rouge, Domaine Combiér 2007** 42  
*From the Northern Rhone; organically made, with spicy notes and dark fruit complexity.*
- 124 **Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine la Barroche 2006** 75  
*Roasted black cherry and berry with a hint of southern French terroir in the finish.*
- 126 **Chinon, “Les Graves” Domaine Gasnier 2007** 26  
*Cabernet Franc that is delicate and approachable.*

**Australia/New Zealand**

- 128 **Shiraz, “St. Henri” Penfolds 2005 South Australia** 85  
*Full-bodied, ultra ripe fruit and a smack of Australian earth.*
- 129 **Cabernet Sauvignon, “Phoenix” Penley Estates 2007 Australia** 35  
*Well balanced, with black current flavors and spiciness typical of Coonawarra.*
- 130 **Shiraz, Cape Mentelle 2005 Margaret River** 36  
*Opulent wine with berry and spice on the palate, finishing with white and black pepper notes.*
- 131 **Shiraz, “The Lodge Hill” Jim Barry 2006 Clare Valley** 45  
*Rich plum and spicy fruit flavors highlight this unfiltered full-bodied wine.*
- 133 **Shiraz, Greenock Creek 2004 Barossa Valley** 95  
*Concentrated and full of intense ripe fruit that lingers on the palate.*

**Italy**

- 134 **Barbera d’Asti, Michele Chiarlo 2006 Piedmont** 28  
*Deep ruby color, with well balanced flavors of dark fruit and earth.*
- 135 **Chianti, Isole e Olena 2006 Toscana** 38  
*Dark fruit and silky tannins highlight this authentic rendition of truly Tuscan Chianti.*
- 136 **Templare, Poggio al Pino 2003 Toscana** 50  
*Made in the style of “Super Tuscan”, this Sangiovese based wine is rich and complex.*

*A concentrated blend of Cabernet, Merlot, and Syrah with moderate oak and richness.*
